THE HISTORY MUSEUM 4th

- 1888: quincy's original public library
 - anchors maine street & the square
 - now **history museum**: exhibits, stained glass gallery, gifts

WASHINGTON PARK 4th-5th

- 1825 quincy's first park , "john square"
- 1858 lincoln-douglas debate site
- now lincoln storyboards & plaza
- blues, farmers market, festivals & events

ST BONIFACE CHURCH 7th

- designed 1962 by renowned architect john benya
- listed: *the most 150 significant structures in illinois*
- 1st mass site of father tolton, america's first black priest
- potawatomie trail of death marker

EAST END HISTORIC DISTRICT 12th-24th

- a standout portion of one of quincy's 4 national register historic districts with scores of restored homes dating to the 1800s
- **1416 maine: quincy jr high school**: built 1837, holds the magnificent art deco morrison theatre
- **16th & maine**: "one of the ten most architecturally-significant corners in the u.s." -*national geographic*



- **1550 maine**: 1852 lorenzo bull house, built by prominent financier for his daughter; now women's city club; **quincy art center** in former carriage house located in rear of property

- **1601 maine**: 1891 newcomb-stillwell mansion, 20k sq ft, 14-karat gold woodwork; once housed a wine cellar and bowling alley in the basement; now **quincy museum**
