Arrive at the Oakley Lindsay Center (OLC), 3rd & York, for restroom break. Enter through main entrance on the north side of building. Plenty of restrooms available.

Exit through the back of building for a snack-to-go from Quincy's retro market, Winking's, established 1948.

Meet tour guide, Ron Frillman in the OLC lobby to begin Step-On Guided Tour through the city. When tour is complete, return Ron to OLC.

WASHINGTON PARK 4TH & MAINE

Walk to Quincy's oldest park and the site of the 1858 Lincoln-Douglas Debate. See the *Changing Slavery* historical marker and the bas-relief sculpture memorializing the debate.

LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATE MUSEUM 128 N 5TH

Across the street, discover the hidden history of one of America's most iconic presidents, with five all-new interactive video exhibits, including *The Turning Point* and a fully renovated facility.

2:30-3:15PM

QUINCY RIVERFRONT + QUINCY UNDERGROUND RAILROAD MUSEUM 415 JERSEY

En route to the museum, drive the riverfront, the crossing point of Latter-day Saints & hundreds of slaves escaping to IL.

Tour the oldest standing 2-story brick house in Quincy, circa 1835. The Underground Railroad Museum was originally built for prominent abolitionist, Dr. Richard Eells and served as the first Underground Railroad stop across the Mississippi River east of Missouri.

Walk to Quincy's original public library, est. 1888 in the Romanesque Revival style. Now home of the History Museum with Quincy area artifacts, a magnificent stained glass gallery, and Mormon exhibit room.
